Submissions should *ONLY* be done online by the advertised deadlines, by following this [CONGRESS ABSTRACT SUBMISSION](#) hyper-link. Authors of accepted abstracts will be required to submit full papers to the same [LINK](#) which will be peer reviewed for publication in the congress book of proceedings.

Poster abstracts should also be submitted to [CONGRESS ABSTRACT SUBMISSION](#) hyper-link. All posters should have a uniform size of A0. Posters will be mounted at designated places at the congress venue. Poster presenters should be available at certain times during the congress.

- 23rd April, 2018 - Deadline for submission of presentation slides.

PRESENTATION LANGUAGE

The abstracts, papers and posters should be in British English with well structured and understandable text.

SUBMISSION POLICY

Authors are limited to two oral presentations.

MODE OF PRESENTATION

- Presentations are welcome in oral and poster formats.
- The organizing committee will provide laptop and LCD projector for all audio-visual presentations.
