

-OUR HISTORY-

he University was founded through Harambee spirit on 5th January 1972, as Western College of Arts and Applied Sciences (WECO) under the stewardship of .the former fiery MP, Masinde Muliro. As chairman of the project executive committee, Muliro worked with Prof. Reuben J. Olembo (then Head, Department of Botany University of Nairobi) as secretary.

The establishment of the College was in response to the needs of the people of Western province to have a College that would provide a training ground for technical manpower requirements for the province and the nation. The College was also expected to inculcate a sense of self-help and self-reliance among its students and facilitate active participation of youth in national development

The first batch of 24 students who were drawn from all parts of the country, joined on March 24, 1977, and enrolled for certificate and diploma in courses, which included mechanical and motor vehicle, electrical, electronic, agriculture, water, building, architecture, accounting, FINANCE etc. In December 2002, WECO became WUCST (Western University College of Science and Technology) after being elevated to a Constituent College of Moi University. Early 2007, President Kibaki elevated WUCST to a full university by assenting to a Bill which also changed the name to MMUST

Your security while at the University

ecurity is the most fundamental factor of students' lives while at the University. In order to ensure the security of its students, MMUST has put various measures in place to safeguard their

operations within and around the University. The MMUST management in cooperation with Full Gospel Churches of Kenya, Kakamega branch, set up a Police Patrol Base at Kefinco Estate to beef up security for the students residing in the area. MMUST has also deployed police officers in uniform and civilian both within and outside the University for security purposes.

In conjunction with the County Government of Kakamega, MMUST has erected high mast lighting systems around the University. The University is looking forward to constructing two (2) high mast lighting systems within the University at Milimani and forest areas for proper lighting in the areas. This will enable smooth operation in those areas at all times and those who may be operating at night for one reason or the other will be properly taken care of.

Additionally, the University has installed Closed- Circuit Television (CCTV) cameras at strategic locations within the University. This is to trail activities which may compromise the safety of the University staff and students. Further, MMUST has mounted scanners for security check at various entrances into the University and key areas such the Administration block. The scanners keep track of luggage carried in by various individuals.

The University has also secluded areas which are 'no go zones' for students. These areas include the University server, water station and the power house. It is also important to note that there are isolated areas in Kakamega forest marked with notices that specify they should not be visited without a forest guard. This guarantees the students' safety during hiking and nature walk.

Regarding the students residing within the University, there is a ten to ten (10a.m to 10p.m) rule which states that male students are not allowed in female hostels before 10a.m, beyond 10p.m and vice versa. Non-resident students are not allowed within the University beyond 10p.m. This is to reduce rape cases among students.

The students are encouraged to keep company of each other by moving around in groups to avoid insecurity incidences. Moving around in groups protects students in various areas where insecurity cases may arise. The MMUST's security department has emergency contacts through which students can report cases of insecurity.

Finally, it is the responsibility of every student to take care of their own security and other students around them. Your security begins with you.

Mmust Showcases Entrepreneurial Acumen During its First Years' Admission Exercise

asinde Muliro University of Science and Technology has had the opportunity to showcase its entrepreneurial acumen during the recent first years' admission exercise which took place on Thursday, 25th August, 2022. The freshmen and women were treated to nutritious and delicious MMUST-made yoghurt which was going at an affordable price of Kshs. 100 for 500ml and Kshs. 50 for 250ml.

The yoghurt is part of a bigger 'Development, Production and Marketing of MMUST Cheese' project, which is funded by the University. According to the project's Principal Investigator, Dr. Mario Kollenberg from the Department of Biological Sciences, the yoghurt is a side product of cheese making. The main objective of the project is to explore the Microbiology of milk processing bacteria and fungi as well as supplying the community with new food products.

Speaking in an interview during the first years' admission, Dr. Kollenberg pointed out that his team is producing a variety of flavours, including vanilla, strawberry, blueberry, chocolate, lemon and spirulina. "We are happy that our yoghurt has been well received in the market look forward to having it on the shelves of supermarkets all over Kenya," he stated.

The Dean School of Natural Sciences (SONAS), Dr. Joseph Owino, where the project is domiciled, reiterated that the yoghurt product, will be mass-produced in the near future. "We are proud of the spirulina flavored yoghurt which has not been in the market before. The spirulina is an innovation by one of our leading nutritional scientists, Prof. Asenath Sigot," said Dr. Owino.

Similarly, the Engineering Students Association (ESA) from the School of Engineering and Built Environment (SEBE) carried the entrepreneurial acumen a notch higher by selling ESA-branded t-shirts to support their club activities. "We used this opportunity to register more students into our club," explained the SEBE male student representative, Mr. Cornelius Kirwa.

Indeed, MMUST is living up to its name as a University of science and technology by utilizing innovation not only to generate income, but also to improve livelihoods and impact the society.



Class Attendance and Completion of Assignments

ur goal is to meet the needs of students with adequate face-toface and hands-on learning every semester. Therefore, attendance of lectures, tutorials, seminars, practical sessions, field trips and other such scheduled courses of instruction is compulsory. It is therefore an offence for a group or class to boycott lectures/ practicals/fieldwork for more than two days consecutively. Students who have missed more than 20% of scheduled lectures, tutorials, seminars, practical sessions and other instruction shall NOT be allowed to sit end of semester examinations and subsequently shall repeat the year or semester as recommended by the Senate.


This is a hall of residence for male students, known as HALL 3. It has a capacity of four hundred and sixty four (464) students. Hall 3 is a three storey building located on the far end of the University compound, adjacent to the University Chaplaincy and Bukhungu International stadium.



This is a hall of residence for male students, known as <u>HALL 2</u>. It has a capacity of four hundred and sixty six (466) students. Hall 2 is a five (5) storey building located on the far end of the University compound, adjacent the basket ball pitch and behind the Administration Block A (ABA).



This is a hall of residence accomodating both male and female students. It has a capacity of four hundred and seventy four (474) for female students and four hundred and seventy eight (478) for male students. It is a complex, complete with a cafeteria. It is located in Milimani, next to the University farm.



This is a female students' hall of residence known as <u>HALL 1.</u> It is one of the oldest buildings in the University. It has a capacity of one hundred and eighty (180) students. Hall 1 is a four (4) storey building located next to the gym, on your way to gate C.




Masinde Muliro University of Science and Technology is home to a state-of-the-art library. The fully equipped and spacious library provides a conducive environment for reading, research and carrying out assignments. Some of the facilities include books, dictionaries, encyclopedias, computers that are used to access digital resources, WI-FI and Ethernet cables to access the internet, and a French resource centre.

The University recently became the official administrator of a digital library with over sixty (60) thousand eBooks which were handed over from Diversity Education Institute Africa (DEI-Africa). The digital library receives new books every day from international authors, writers and publishers.

A sinde Muliro University of Science and Technology (MMUST) has provided topnotch service delivery during the admission of the 2022/2023 first year students. The student admission exercise, which began on 25th August, 2022, took place across all our campuses. All the Schools and Departments in the University received support from the Customer Care Centre, the Finance department as well as the Office of the Dean of students to provide swift and effective service delivery.

Speaking during admission, the Dean, School of Education (SEDU), Prof. Moses Poipoi pointed out that the admission process was seamless. "We are expecting a minimum of 1,500 students. For this reason, we have innovatively designed cards to organize our clients on first come first served basis. With the help of the University security team, the clients were directed to wait under the tents to avoid the long queues and commotion. We look forward to the orientation on 6th September, 2022," he said.

Commenting on the improvements in this year's admission process, Prof. Poipoi shared his delight regarding the admission of the School's first ever deaf student, who has been admitted to pursue a Diploma in Early Childhood Development Education (ECDE). Further, he acknowledged that MMUST gives opportunities and looks after persons living with disabilities. The Dean, School of Engineering and Built Environment (SEBE), Prof. Eng. Bernadette Sabuni shared that the school expects to admit about 400 students. She revealed that the school receives a number of students from the industry who are seeking to upgrade their studies. The Dean appreciated the support such students bring to the School through the assistance they offer to fresh students in getting attachment opportunities.

"Preparation is key and my team commenced the preparations for the first years' admission exercise three days earlier. We began attending to our clients at 7.30 am and by 9.00am, there was no queue. I commend the University for providing stable internet which enabled us to move fast," she added.

The Dean, School of Arts and Social Sciences (SASS), Dr. Rose Auma said the School anticipates a total of 550 students. She spoke highly of the strategy set, saying that it enabled her team to establish five points that allowed them to attend to five students simultaneously. The process, which took less than five minutes per client ensured that by 9.30 am they did not have any queue. "We will launch the reviewed programmes in September. The 2022/2023 students we are admitting will pioneer the programmes," added Dr. Auma. to the clients.

According to the Dean, School of Agriculture, Veterinary Sciences and Technology (SAVET), Prof. Jacob Wakhungu, the school expects 400 students, with the department of Agribusiness and Extension Management receiving the highest number. In an effort to market the school, the team designed two banners detailing its programmes. He applauded his team for effective and efficient services to the clients.


The other schools that carried out the first years' admission exercise, included: School of Nursing, Midwifery and Paramedical Sciences (SONMAPS), School of Natural Sciences (SONAS), School of Computing and Informatics (SCI), School of Public Health, Biomedical sciences and Technology (SPHBS&T), School of disaster Management and Humanitarian Assistant (SDMHA), School of Business and Economics (SOBE), as well as School of Medicine (SOM). All these schools reported smooth flow of activities during the event as a result of uninterrupted supply of internet and no power outages. The schools recorded a positive turnout for admission.

The highly successful application of digital admission carried out by MMUST is an indication that our University has made tremendous improvement in the admission processes. Despite the very few challenges experienced, the future can only be brighter.
