

MASINDE MULIRO UNIVERSITY OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY VICE CHANCELLOR'S ROUND UP FOR THE WEEK ENDING, FRIDAY 9TH DECEMBER, 2022

- The Kakamega Central, Sub-County Security team led by the Deputy County Commissioner, Mr. Ndaya Ngalya on 6th December 2022 conducted a security survey at Masinde Muliro University of Science and Technology (MMUST) ahead of the 18th Graduation Ceremony held today, 9th December 2022. The team later paid a courtesy call to the Office of the Vice-Chancellor, to brief him on the findings of the survey where they pointed out that security measures have been put in place in readiness for the big day.
- The MMUST Vice Chancellor on 6th December, 2022 hosted Lubao FM Journalists. The event which took place at the Vice Chancellor's office was geared towards interviewing the VC on the level of preparedness towards the 18th graduation ceremony. The Vice Chancellor acknowledged that the University has achieved a lot and preparations are underway in readiness for the big day. He revealed that the University is expecting 3,802 graduands and a good number of dignitaries, including, religious and political leaders as well as the Prime Cabinet Secretary, Hon. Wycliffe Musalia Mudavadi who will receive an Honoris Causa (Honorary Degree) during the graduation ceremony.
- The Senator of Kakamega County, Hon. Dr. Boni Khalwale, on 7th December, 2022 visited MMUST ahead of the 18th graduation ceremony. The Senator, who was received by the Vice Chancellor pointed out that MMUST is one of the Universities in the country offering quality education, adding that the institution has greatly contributed to the growth of Kakamega County. He commended MMUST's preparedness towards the upcoming graduation ceremony set to attract notable personalities from various sectors across the country.
- On 7th December, 2022, MMUST received a cheque worth fifty thousand Kenya Shillings (Kshs. 50,000) from Diamond Trust Bank Kenya (DTB) as a donation towards the 18th graduation ceremony. The DTB team, led by the Kakamega branch Manager, Mr. William Amayo, paid a courtesy call to the Vice Chancellor to discuss possible areas of collaboration. Several issues were discussed, including, student mentorship, staff welfare, assisting the University in financing its projects, as well as management and advisories regarding the University projects.

MMUST have rolled out over three thousand (3,000) graduands to the job market in a ceremonious graduation ceremony held today, 9th December 2022 at the University Graduation Square. This ceremony that brought together dignitaries and key stakeholders from various sectors, was graced by the 5th President of Kenya, H.E. Hon. Dr. William Samoei Ruto. The highly decorated ceremony themed 'Mainstreaming Science, Technology and Innovation for Sustainable Development', saw MMUST confer an honorary award (Honoris Causa- Honorary Degree) to the Prime Cabinet Secretary, Hon. Wycliffe Musalia Mudavadi.
