The increase in research involving a range of people, disciplines and countries, particularly to address global challenges, requires us to consider more thoughtfully how this kind of research is undertaken in every respect. International research relationships enable us to reflect on how we work in diverse teams, how we communicate, manage, support and lead such research endeavours, and, critically, in ways that are fair and just for all involved. Even though there is widespread agreement that these research projects must be equitable, what does this mean in practice and for everyone involved? What are equitable international research partnerships?

As the UK Collaborative on Development Research say: 'Whilst there is no agreed universal definition for equitable partnerships, equitable partnerships are frequently defined as:'

Partnerships in which there is mutual participation, mutual trust and respect, mutual benefit and equal value placed on each partners contribution at all stages of the research process. (Equity in research partnerships – accessed 07 April 2024)

The summit brings together academic, research and professional service staff from the Universities of Ghana, Cape Town, Nelson Mandela, KNUST, MMUST and Southampton, who have an interest in strengthening international relationships and exploring how we can build and maintain these relationships, as well as in developing new research projects.
